CITY WITH DWELLINGS

There are many homeless in Winston-Salem that agency permanent shelters are not able to accommodate during the winter months. Churches in Winston-Salem (City with Dwellings) have come together to provide shelter and food supplies for daily living and dignity to those who have nowhere to live or sleep.

St. John's Church and School have partnered with St. Timothy's Episcopal Church, who provides women with food and shelter during these cold months. There are many opportunities for us to serve. These include:

- Nightly check-in from 7-9 pm
- Providing and serving dinner from 7:00-8:30 pm
- All night assistance needed (2 per night with the regular staff) 7:00pm to 6:30 am

They are also in need of the following donations:

- New pillows
- Pillow protectors
- Women's underwear (Sizes 6-9)
- White crew socks
- Travel size toiletries
- Feminine hygiene products
- Clorox/Lysol wipes
- Tax deductible donations to cover operational expenses

There is also a need for other items that will be taken to other community service providers (police, etc.). These include:

- Blankets
- Clothing, coats, shoes, socks
- Full size toiletries
