Pastor's Corner

The term Introit means "entrance". Oddly enough the beginning of the service is actually not the beginning. As strange as that sounds, we must look at the history and development of the liturgy to get a feel for why this is the case. First, the Order of Confession and Absolution is in reality a totally separate service. We lead off with this small order of worship on Sunday rather than doing it on Saturday, which was the history of this particular worship form. The congregants gathered on Saturday to do their confession and receive absolution and then they spent the rest of Saturday in meditation and fasting to prepare for Sunday worship and the reception of Holy Communion. We have united these two services as a convenience. The beginning of the worship service with a hymn is a relatively new practice since the invention of keyboard instruments and their inclusion in worship. When the liturgy was being put together and standardized, voices were the only instruments used. So historically, the Introit is the actual beginning of the worship service. We enter into the worship of God here. The Introit follows thematically with the other parts of the service and each Introit is unique to the particular Sunday of the church year assigned. It is constructed with Psalm verses, one of which is used to introduce it and to close off the Introit itself.
