Pastor's Corner

Kyrie Eleison or Kyrie continues the setting of the worship service and precedes the teaching portions of the service. It follows on the heels of the confession and the Introit or entrance to the service. From the Latin and Greek it literally translates, "Lord have pity or mercy". So we are actually singing a response that has been used in worship for over 1,500 years. The Kyrie sets the tone for God being the sole source of our worship and the only source by which we can accomplish the message of the verses being chanted to us by the cantor. We are literally asking God to grant us peaceful prayer, proper worship, salvation, peace in the broadest sense, contentment and unity. These things we acknowledge that we are unable to provide in and of ourselves and we need God to gift them to us so that our worship is meaningful. This, along with the other elements that we have dealt with already, point to God as being the source of our worship and creator of our peace and growth as receiving children of God, benefiting from His good gifts.

Bible on a Stick. Last year St. John's supported the "Bible on a Stick" program managed by Faith Comes by Hearing. We donated over \$1000 to this cause, which allowed the organization to send a BibleStick to one soldier for each \$25 donated. We will support this program again this year. What we collect will be sent to Faith by Hearing and they will send out the sticks to military chaplains, who will then share them with soldiers. We cannot choose the soldier. Each stick has the New Testament and a number of Psalms on it. In addition, for each BibleStick sent to a soldier, he or she will receive a card for a free MP3 Audio Bible for spouses and children. The entire military family can be blessed in this way.

Each BibleStick has been designed in conjunction with the military such that they are not too obtrusive. They are black, run on an included AAA battery, have ear buds and are easy to operate. Should you wish to look at one, there will be one at the church secretary's desk or see Don Adamick. There will be a video at the desk too.

Should you wish to support the program, you may write a check to St. John's and clearly identify in the Memo part of the check that the donation is for the BibleStick program, or put cash in an envelope and write for BibleStick program on it and put either in the collection plate. Even though it requires \$25 for each BibleStick there is **no implication** that one has to contribute that much; our donations will be pooled and sent to Faith Comes by Hearing, as we did last year.

BY INTRODUCING THE PROGRAM IN OCTOBER ALL DONATIONS WILL BE MATCHED DOLLAR FOR DOLLAR. OUR PROGRAM THIS YEAR WILL END ON NOVEMBER 13.
