Call To Worship

- P: By grace you're saved, grace free and boundless; may you believe, and doubt it not. Why wonder at this Word of Promise; has Scripture ever, falsehood taught?
- C: No! Then this Word must true remain; by grace I too, will life obtain.
- P: By grace! So none, dare claim to merit; your works and conduct have no worth, God in His love sent our Redeemer; Christ Jesus, to this sinful earth.
- C: His death did for my sins atone; and I am saved by grace, alone.
- P: By grace God's Son, our only Savior; came down to earth, to bear your sin. Was it because of your own merit; that Jesus died your soul, to win?

First Lesson: Ezekial 33:10-13

¹⁰ "Therefore you, O son of man, say to the house of Israel: 'Thus you say, "If our transgressions and our sins *lie* upon us, and we pine^[a] away in them, how can we then live?" ' ¹¹ Say to them: 'As I live,' says the Lord God, 'I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way and live. Turn, turn from your evil ways! For why should you die, O house of Israel?'

¹² "Therefore you, O son of man, say to the children of your people: 'The righteousness of the righteous man shall not deliver him in the day of his transgression; as for the wickedness of the wicked, he shall not fall because of it in the day that he turns from his wickedness; nor shall the righteous be able to live because of *his righteousness* in the day that he sins.' ¹³ When I say to the righteous *that* he shall surely live, but he trusts in his own righteousness and commits iniquity, none of his righteous works shall be remembered; but because of the iniquity that he has committed, he shall die.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14

14 "For many are called, but few are chosen."

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 22nd chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord

And Jesus answered and spoke to them again by parables and said: ² "The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who arranged a marriage for his son, 3 and sent out his servants to call those who were invited to the wedding; and they were not willing to come. ⁴ Again, he sent out other servants, saying, 'Tell those who are invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and fatted cattle are killed, and all things are ready. Come to the wedding." '5 But they made light of it and went their ways, one to his own farm, another to his business. ⁶ And the rest seized his servants, treated them [a] spitefully, and killed them. 7 But when the king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. 8 Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. ⁹ Therefore go into the highways, and as many as you find, invite to the wedding.' ¹⁰ So those servants went out into the highways and gathered together all whom they found, both bad and good. And the wedding hall was filled with guests. ¹¹ "But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment. 12 So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. ¹³ Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, [b] take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.



Preface


- P: The Lord be with you.

forever and ever. Amen.


