Processional Hymn: #660 "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus"

Invocation/Confession/Absolution

- P: "Be very strong; be careful to obey all that is written in the Book of the Law of Moses, without turning aside to the right or to the left. Do not turn to false gods but you are to hold fast to the Lord your God. (Joshua 23:6-8)
- C: Lord, we confess that as we live life we serve many other "gods". We serve the "god of self", doing what we want, doing that which pleases ourselves. We serve the "god of stuff", our lives are driven in the pursuit of more money and more stuff. We serve the "god of pleasure" our lives are driven in the pursuit of pleasure that satisfies our flesh, Lord, we serve the "gods" of this world whenever we make anything more important than You! Forgive us!
- P: Be careful, then, to love the Lord your God. (Joshua 23:11)
- C: We have not always loved you with our whole heart.

- P: You know with all your heart and soul that not one of all the good promises the Lord your God gave you has failed. Every promise has been fulfilled; not one has failed. (Joshua 23:14)
- C: We thank you, God, that You keep all Your promises! Especially Your promise to forgive us for Jesus' sake!
- P: If you violate the covenant of the Lord your God...and go and serve other gods...the Lord's anger will burn against you. (Joshua 23:16)
- C: Father God, we confess that we continually break Your Law and violate Your Covenant. We have no hope except Your mercy and forgiveness in Jesus! Forgive us for Jesus' sake.
- P: Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve...But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord. (Joshua 24:15)
- C: Far be it from us to forsake the Lord to serve other gods. We, too, will serve the Lord because He is our God. (Joshua 24:16-18)
- P: You are not able to serve the Lord. He is a holy God; he is a jealous God. (Joshua 24:19)
- C: We will serve the Lord. (Joshua 24:21) And may God forgive us when we do not!
- P: Rejoice! God's holy anger against sin was satisfied by the price Jesus paid in your place. Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus! (Romans 8:1) Your sin is forgiven! Go in peace and serve the Lord!
- C: Thanks be to God!

C: Amen.



P: The Lord be with you.

First Lesson: Joshua 7:1-14 (Israel punished for Achan's Sin)

But the children of Israel [a] committed a trespass regarding the accursed [b] things, for Achan the son of Carmi, the son of [c] Zabdi, the son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, took of the accursed things; so the anger of the Lord burned against the children of Israel.

² Now Joshua sent men from Jericho to Ai, which *is* beside Beth Aven, on the east side of Bethel, and spoke to them, saying, "Go up and spy out the country." So the men went up and spied out Ai. ³ And they returned to Joshua and said to him, "Do not let all the people go up, but let about two or three thousand men go up and attack Ai. Do not weary all the people there, for *the people of Ai are* few." ⁴ So about three thousand men went up there from the people, but they fled before the men of Ai. ⁵ And the men of Ai struck down about thirty-six men, for they chased them *from* before the gate as far as Shebarim, and struck them down on the descent; therefore the ^[d] hearts of the people melted and became like water.

⁶Then Joshua tore his clothes, and fell to the earth on his face before the ark of the Lord until evening, he and the elders of Israel; and they put dust on their heads. ⁷And Joshua said, "Alas, Lord ^[e]God, why have You brought this people over

the Jordan at all—to deliver us into the hand of the Amorites, to destroy us? Oh, that we had been content, and dwelt on the other side of the Jordan! ⁸ O Lord, what shall I say when Israel turns its ^[1]back before its enemies? ⁹ For the Canaanites and all the inhabitants of the land will hear *it*, and surround us, and cut off our name from the earth. Then what will You do for Your great name?"

¹⁰ So the Lord said to Joshua: "Get up! Why do you lie thus on your face? ¹¹ Israel has sinned, and they have also transgressed My covenant which I commanded them. For they have even taken some of the ^[g]accursed things, and have both stolen and deceived; and they have also put *it* among their own stuff. ¹² Therefore the children of Israel could not stand before their enemies, *but* turned *their* backs before their enemies, because they have become doomed to destruction. Neither will I be with you anymore, unless you destroy the accursed from among you. ¹³ Get up, sanctify the people, and say, 'Sanctify yourselves for tomorrow, because thus says the Lord God of Israel: "*There is* an accursed thing in your midst, O Israel; you cannot stand before your enemies until you take away the accursed thing from among you." ¹⁴ In the morning therefore you shall be brought according to your tribes. And it shall be *that* the tribe which the Lord takes shall come according to families; and the family which the Lord takes shall come by households; and the household which the Lord takes shall come man by man.

C: Thanks be to God.

Second Lesson: Joshua 7:19-26 (Achan punished for his sin)

¹⁹ Now Joshua said to Achan, "My son, I beg you, give glory to the Lord God of Israel, and make confession to Him, and tell me now what you have done; do not hide *it* from me."

²⁰ And Achan answered Joshua and said, "Indeed I have sinned against the Lord God of Israel, and this is what I have done: ²¹ When I saw among the spoils a beautiful Babylonian garment, two hundred shekels of silver, and a wedge of gold weighing fifty shekels, I ^[a]coveted them and took them. And there they are, hidden in the earth in the midst of my tent, with the silver under it."

²² So Joshua sent messengers, and they ran to the tent; and there it was, hidden in his tent, with the silver under it. ²³ And they took them from the midst of the tent, brought them to Joshua and to all the children of Israel, and laid them out before the Lord. ²⁴ Then Joshua, and all Israel with him, took Achan the son of Zerah, the silver, the garment, the wedge of gold, his sons, his daughters, his oxen, his donkeys, his sheep, his tent, and all that he had, and they brought them to the Valley of Achor. ²⁵ And Joshua said, "Why have you troubled us? The Lord will trouble you this

day." So all Israel stoned him with stones; and they burned them with fire after they had stoned them with stones.


²⁶ Then they raised over him a great heap of stones, still there to this day.

So the Lord turned from the fierceness of His anger. Therefore the name of that place has been called the Valley of ^[b]Achor to this day.

Holy Gospel: Matthew 18:7-9 (Causing others to sin)

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 18th chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord

⁷Woe to the world because of [a] offenses! For offenses must come, but woe to that man by whom the offense comes!

⁸ "If your hand or foot causes you to sin, cut it off and cast *it* from you. It is better for you to enter into life lame or maimed, rather than having two hands or two feet, to be cast into the everlasting fire. ⁹ And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and cast *it* from you. It is better for you to enter into life with one eye, rather than having two eyes, to be cast into [b] hell fire.

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: Praise to You O Christ.

C I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

C: And also with you.


P: Lift up your hearts.




Lord's Prayer
