Call to Worship:

- P: The earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea. The Lord is in His holy temple; let all the earth be silent before Him.
- C: Lord, I have heard of Your fame; I stand in awe of Your deeds, O Lord. Renew them in our day, in our time make them known; in wrath remember mercy.

Confession of Sins: Psalm 51:1-4, 9-12, 17 (In Unison)

Have mercy upon me, O God,

According to Your lovingkindness;

According to the multitude of Your tender mercies,

Blot out my transgressions.

² Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,

And cleanse me from my sin.

³ For I acknowledge my transgressions,

And my sin *is* always before me. ⁴ Against You, You only, have I sinned, And done *this* evil in Your sight— That You may be found just ^[a]when You speak, *And* blameless when You judge.

⁹ Hide Your face from my sins, And blot out all my iniquities.

 ¹⁰ Create in me a clean heart, O God, And renew a steadfast spirit within me.
 ¹¹ Do not cast me away from Your presence, And do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. ¹² Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, And uphold me *by Your* generous Spirit.

¹⁷ The sacrifices of God *are* a broken spirit,
 A broken and a contrite heart—
 These, O God, You will not despise.

(Please Be Seated)

First Lesson: Psalm 116:1-9 (The Lord hears and answers our prayers) I love the LORD, because He has heard Mv voice and my supplications. ²Because He has inclined His ear to me. Therefore I will call upon Him as long as I live. ³The ^[a]pains of death surrounded me, And the bangs of Sheol claid hold of me: I found trouble and sorrow. ⁴ Then I called upon the name of the LORD: "O LORD. I implore You, deliver my soul!" ⁵ Gracious *is* the LORD, and righteous; Yes, our God is merciful. ⁶ The LORD preserves the simple; I was brought low, and He saved me. ⁷ Return to your rest, O my soul, For the LORD has dealt bountifully with you. ⁸ For You have delivered my soul from death, My eyes from tears, And my feet from falling. ⁹ I will walk before the LORD In the land of the living.

- C: Thanks be to God.

Second Lesson: James 3:1-12 (Watch your tongue)

My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment. ² For we all stumble in many things. If anyone does not stumble in word, he *is* a ^[a]perfect man, able also to bridle the whole body. ³ ^[b]Indeed, we put bits in horses' mouths that they may obey us, and we turn their whole body. ⁴ Look also at ships: although they are so large and are driven by fierce winds, they are turned by a

very small rudder wherever the pilot desires. ⁵ Even so the tongue is a little member and boasts great things.

See how great a forest a little fire kindles! ⁶ And the tongue *is* a fire, a world of ^[C]iniquity. The tongue is so set among our members that it defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the course of ^[C]nature; and it is set on fire by ^[E]hell. ⁷ For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and creature of the sea, is tamed and has been tamed by mankind. ⁸ But no man can tame the tongue. *It is* an unruly evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ With it we bless our God and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the ^[I]similitude of God. ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so. ¹¹ Does a spring send forth fresh *water* and bitter from the same opening? ¹² Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? ^[C]Thus no spring yields both salt water and fresh.

Children's Message

(Please Rise)

Holy Gospel: Luke 7:36-50; 8:1-3

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 7th chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

³⁶ Then one of the Pharisees asked Him to eat with him. And He went to the Pharisee's house, and sat down to eat. ³⁷ And behold, a woman in the city who was a sinner, when she knew that *Jesus* sat at the table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil, ³⁸ and stood at His feet behind *Him* weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped *them* with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed *them* with the fragrant oil. ³⁹ Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw *this*, he spoke to himself, saying, "This Man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman *this is* who is touching Him, for she is a sinner."

⁴⁰ And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you."

So he said, "Teacher, say it."

⁴¹ "There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. ⁴² And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?"

⁴³ Simon answered and said, "I suppose the *one* whom he forgave more."

And He said to him, "You have rightly judged." ⁴⁴ Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped *them* with the hair of her head. ⁴⁵ You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. ⁴⁶ You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. ⁴⁷ Therefore I say to you, her sins, which *are* many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, *the same* loves little."

⁴⁸ Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

⁴⁹ And those who sat at the table with Him began to say to themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?"

⁵⁰ Then He said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you. Go in peace."

- 8 Now it came to pass, afterward, that He went through every city and village, preaching and ^[a]bringing the glad tidings of the kingdom of God. And the twelve *were* with Him, ² and certain women who had been healed of evil spirits and ^[b]infirmities—Mary called Magdalene, out of whom had come seven demons, ³ and Joanna the wife of Chuza, Herod's steward, and Susanna, and many others who provided for ^[c]Him from their ^[d]substance.
- P: This is the Gospel of the Lord
- C: Praise to You, O Christ.

Confession of Faith: (from the Catechism)

- Q: Why do you say "I believe in the forgiveness of sins?"
- A: I believe in the forgiveness of sins because God through Christ has declared forgiveness to sinful humans.
- Q: What moves God to forgive sins?
- A: God forgives sins because of Christ's sacrifice for sinners.
- Q: Where does God offer the forgiveness of sins?
- A: In the Gospel.
- Q: How do you receive this forgiveness of sins?
- A: Through faith, by believing this Gospel.
- Q: Why can and should you be sure of the forgiveness of sins?
- A. I can and should be sure of the forgiveness of my sins because God keeps His promises in Christ.
