PALM SUNDAY

Reflecting on Our Humble, Selfless, ad Unconditionally Loving King

In the Gospel of John in the New Testament of the Bible, we find the story of Palm Sunday. When we look at the verses around John, chapter 12, we see that, six days before Passover, Jesus is with Lazarus, Mary, and Martha. A few days before this, we see that Jesus had raised Lazarus from the dead. Just take a second to visualize the timeline of what's going on. Jesus had traveled to raise Lazarus from the dead; is now present with Lazarus, Mary, and Martha; will ride into Passover on a baby donkey; predict His own death; have people not believe Him, despite all the miracles He has shown them; and then wash His disciples' feet – all on the way to giving His life for us all. What a humble, selfless, and unconditionally loving king!

We remember Palm Sunday as part of the last week of Lent and the beginning of Holy Week. It is the Sunday before Easter. Scripture tells us in John Chapter 12 beginning at verse 12:

"The next day, the great crowd that had come for the Feast heard that Jesus was on the way to Jerusalem. They took palm branches and went out to meet him shouting: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the King of Israel!" Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it, as it is written. "Do not be afraid, O Daughter of Zion; see, your king is coming, seated on a donkey's colt."

A typical king would not be seen on a donkey, let alone a baby donkey. They would enter on horseback in an extravagant

way. We see our humble, selfless, and unconditionally loving king enter on the back of a baby donkey, showing us how different He is from worldly kings. Most kings would move in plain power, Jesus moved in pure peace.

The palm branches were seen as symbols of victory in the culture and time period. The people shouted praises to Jesus and laid down symbolic palm branches showing that they trusted He was victorious.

As we anticipate Palm Sunday, don't let this season pass without taking time to reflect and respond. As we look at how Jesus lived His life in the weeks and days before He sacrificed His for ours, may we seek for ways amid the mundane moments of busy life to imitate His humility, selflessness, and unconditional love in our own lives.



A LOOK AT THE STONE

The stone that enclosed Jesus' tomb was the only barrier to someone getting inside the tomb to steal Jesus' body. That's because the tomb was one big solid rock. There was no underground passage or back wall opening. The only access inside the tomb was through the front which was covered by the big rock and guarded day and night. The chief priests and Pharisees wanted to make sure no one could steal the body after Jesus promised He would rise on the third day.

Why did the angel roll the stone away? Why didn't Jesus do it Himself? The simple answer is that He chose not to. According to Matthew Henry's commentary, if Jesus had rolled the stone away, it would have been like a prisoner breaking out of jail. Jesus didn't want anyone to think He was breaking the law, so the angel acted like an officer to open the tomb.

Spiritually speaking, the large stone represents our sins. When it was rolled away, our sins were overtaken by Jesus's resurrection. Death was conquered. Jesus proved He was who He said – the Son of God. The empty grave showed the world He had risen. His mission was complete.

He has risen indeed! Happy Resurrection Day!
