New Communion Procedure for our Traditional Service Next Sunday

Beginning next Sunday, during our Traditional Worship Service, we will have both sides of the church come up the center aisle for communion as begin offering the Common Cup during Communion.

- Pastors and/or an Elder will distribute the regular communion wafer (host).
- Ushers and/or Communion assistants will distribute the wine via communion trays.
- An Elder in the center (closer to the communion rails) will distribute the gluten free host and the wine in the Common Cup.

Below are the procedures to help make this happen smoothly:

If you normally receive the regular host from the pastor, and would like an individual cup (as we have been doing):

After receiving the regular host from the pastor, continue the same side that you came up, and take from the tray closest to you. Then you can continue around to your pew.

If you normally receive the regular host from the pastor and would like the Common Cup:

After receiving the regular host from the pastor, continue forward up the center aisle. And the center Elder will be there to offer the Common cup. Once you have received from the common cup, please exit to the side your came up on, back to your pew.

If you normally receive the gluten free host from the pastor and would like an individual cup (as you have been doing):

After receiving the gluten free host from the <u>Center Elder</u>, turn to the side which you came up and receive the individual cup before continuing around to your pew.

If you normally receive the gluten free host from the pastor, and would like the Common Cup: Come up the middle of the center aisle, letting the elder know that you would like both the gluten free host and the common cup, then partake first the gluten free host and then the common cup. Before returning to the side aisle of the side of the church you originally came from.

LWML Convention Omaha, Nebraska

Kathleen & Bruce Sawicki and Cheryl Wulfert had a wonderful time at the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) Convention in Omaha, Nebraska June 26-29, 2025. The convention started on Thursday night with a worship service with 4,000 people attending. The singing was great. Our first offering always goes to the new Mite Goal.

Friday morning started with singing. Then came the Banner Procession. Each of the 40 Districts of the LWML creates a banner and the District President carries it in. Paula Daniels is our Carolinas District President. We had Bible Study by Christina Hergenrader who is a devotional writer for Concordia Publishing House (CPH).

In the morning, we voted on amendments to the Bylaws and voted on a Mission Goal. The goal voted on was \$2,600,000. This was later amended to \$2,622,270 so that the final project will be fully funded. Our first Mission Speaker was **Deaconess Kelly Bristow from Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch**. In the afternoon, we had a keynote address, and our 33 Mission Grants were presented. The second offering was for Camp Linn Haven. Our next Mission Speaker was **Chelsea Irwin who is the LCMS Missionary Coordinator for the Eurasia Region**.

Saturday morning started with a procession of flags from all the countries that the LWML has helped over the years. We had our second Bible Study and then Rev Kevin Robson, LCMS Chief Mission Officer introduced Carol Halter. Carol has been a Missionary in Hong Kong and China for 44 years. The next Mission Speaker was Rachel Potts from Lutheran Braile Workers.

The afternoon Mission Speaker was **Rev. Dr. John Reinke from Lutheran Deaf Outreach**. Then the delegates voted on officers to lead us for the next four years. We adjourned early for our Mission Walk. The walk was across the bridge between Nebraska and Iowa.

Sunday morning our Mission Speaker was **Rev. Paul Ernewein from Forged by Fire Services.** We ended with a Sending Church Service

100th Anniversary

Do you know......? Arden Lackey, current member of St. John's since 1945, took time to share some St. John's memories with me. "Dad worked in Greensboro on weekends. He would bring our family to church on his way to work on Sunday morning. Mom would pack us a lunch and we would stay at church until he came to pick us up around 4pm. We had Walther League in the afternoon and sometimes church meetings. Gradually more people started bringing their lunch and staying too. We had a good time. Later in years, our family rode the Greyhound bus to downtown and then took a city bus to church (we lived in Stanleyville). Pastor Meibohm had a 1946 Ford Coach. On Saturday he would drive around and pick up 3 families- 3 Hayes children, 2 Blizzard children and 3 Lackey children and bring us to church for Confirmation class. He was very dedicated to the youth and their Confirmation. When Pastor Rupprecht came he started Confirmation on Sundays, along with Walther League and other meetings. Church was a close family then. The 40s were financially hard and the 50s things began to "pick up". Forest Houston (Dot Anderson's father-in-law) used to drive a Greyhound Bus for a living. When the churches in the area wanted to go somewhere for an activity, Forest would bring one of the big Greyhound buses and take all of us! My parishioner had been training his children in thrift and saving, but what, I asked him, were his means of training them to generosity? He had none. Perhaps the old scrapper has a point. In many, many homes Johnny is being given training in thrift and saving.
